

Takeaway (Continued)

- Plan to assess what students already know and bring to the classroom.
- Keep cultural and linguistic differences in mind when developing and assessing assignments/activities.
- Model cross-cultural and international awareness for students.
- Encourage conversations that examine and develop cultural awareness.
- Look to models like Hofstede's taxonomy for cross-cultural communication (but don't limit yourself to them): http://geert-hofstede.com/
